Description of the module

Part 1

I.1. Calendar

Make a yearly wall calendar where there are all the month and days. This is a

good revision of all the months and the cardinal numbers. Every 3 students -

mini group have the 12 month template and at the end we make a collage of all

the months.

Materials used: crayons, colour pencils, brown paper, copy paper

<u>Used methods:</u> project, revision

I.2. Holidays all year long

On a power point presentation we watch information about all the holidays all

year long. These holidays are: New Year's Day, Valentine's Days, Saint Patrick

Day, Mother's Days, etc... There is interesting information about these holidays

that can be discussed and compared to Hungarian traditions of those days.

Materials used: Smart board, internet, 1.2.holidays.ppt

<u>Used method:</u> presentations, discussion

I.3. Holiday 'stickers'

There are little 'stickers' in the worksheet and students have to find their place

on the calendar we made at the beginning of the class. They can colour those

stickers to fit to the Holiday e.g. colouring the leprechaun green, Valentine's Day

pink or red, etc ... Then they have to glue those stickers to the appropriate

place. After everyone finished we make a small exhibition in the classroom.

<u>Used method:</u> revision, project

I.4. Puzzle

Revision of the names of the holidays we can play puzzle. Students get 3 holiday

pictures cut into different shapes and they have to rearrange the pieces into

those 3 pictures. The group that finishes first wins real stickers.

Used method: game, revision

I.5. Bingo

Revising the names of the holidays with the BINGO cards is an easy way.

Students hear the names many times and they learn it without recognizing that.

I.6. British Holidays

Students learn easily through videos. This video demonstrates all the British

holidays in an interesting way. Students have to make notes about their holiday

(this can be chosen voluntarily or randomly) At the end of the video student

share their notes and we discuss facts about each holiday.

II.1. Celebrations, Anniversaries

With the help of pictures students learn the phrases, words for birthday, name

day, anniversary, party etc.

II.2. Organising a party

With the help of the worksheet students have a checklist what needs to be done

to organise a party- There is a checklist of things that have to be done few

weeks, days, and hours before the party. This can be used for further party

organising too. This way, students can learn new phrases and use them

instantly.

more flashcards and plan the menu of the party. We make a menu card too.

Students revise the learnt words with the word search puzzle.

II.7. Crossword

With the help of a crossword students revise and learn the new phrases better.

II.8. Story of a birthday party

Students read about someone's birthday party that was last Sunday. With the help of the revising questions we discuss the story and what happened on last

Sunday using simple past tense.

<u>Used method:</u> reading comprehension, discussion

II.9. Planning game

Students have to plan a party. They have to write down all the things what you need for that type of the party - others have to guess what type of party that

will be.

<u>Used method</u>: planning, pair work

II.10. Greeting card

After everyone knows how to organise a party, students make an invitation card or greeting card to the party.

<u>Materials used</u>: drawing paper, cardboard, crayon, colour pencils

<u>Used method</u>: project
